What is Educational Talent Search?

The Educational Talent Search program is one of the federal TRIO programs authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965. Educational Talent Search is a pre-college program that provides educational services, workshops and counseling to eligible participants interested in pursuing post-secondary educational opportunities.

What is the Purpose of Educational Talent Search?

Its legislative purpose is to help participants complete high school and to successfully enter post-secondary educational programs. Educational Talent Search also provides students and their families with information and technical assistance in the college admissions process and in the completion of financial aid forms.

What services are provided?
