Olszewski Announces Aggressive New Actions in Response to COVID-19

Pandemic

National Guard to support meal distribution; Saturday meal distribution expanding to 30 sites; Baltimore County announces hiring freeze for non-essential employees

TOWSON, MD— Baltimore County Executive Johnny Olszewski today announced a series of aggressive new efforts to expand Baltimore County's coordinated response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- The Maryland Army National Guard will support food distribution efforts following a request from the County
- Baltimore County is significantly expanding the number of sites for Saturday meal distribution
- Olszewski has implemented a freeze on non-essential hiring
 Maryland Army National Guard to Support County's Food Distribution
 Efforts

Maryland Army National Guard troops will support the County's food distribution operations and continue to provide additional planning and logistical support to enhance the County's emergency response.

"These are neighbors from our communities here to help us in our time of need. We are so grateful for the Guard's commitment as our County continues to respond to this unprecedented pandemic," Olszewski said.

Beginning Friday, April 10, National Guard troops will support weekday meal distribution at all seven Department of Recreation and Parks locations. Full details on weekday meal distribution will be available at baltimorecountymd.gov/foodhelp.

Beginning Saturday, April 11, National Guard troops will support Saturday meal distribution at all Saturday distribution locations, including new locations. Full details on Saturday meal distribution will be available at baltimorecountymd.gov/foodhelp.

Olszewski <u>previously requested</u> the Maryland National Guard to provide humanitarian and emergency management assistance to County government.

County to Significantly Expand Saturday Meal Distribution Sites

To support food insecure families amid the COVID-19 pandemic, Olszewski also announced that the County is significantly expanding the number of locations for its Saturday food distribution program.

This week, Baltimore County will purchase 23,100 frozen, prepacked meals to distribute to food insecure residents at 30 sites across the County. Sites were identified through data-analysis by Baltimore County and the National Guard based on prior meal distribution. Previously, Baltimore County was providing weekend distribution at 11 sites.

"Ensuring every County resident has enough to eat during this crisis is a top priority," Olszewski said. "Thanks to the Guard's support, we can do even more for Baltimore County's families and we'll continue to work hand-in-hand to help provide food security, reduce the spread of the virus, and save lives."

On Saturday April 11 at 11 a.m., meals will be distributed on a first come, first served basis at the following locations:

County Executive Olszewski Announces Hiring Freeze

In anticipation of budget pressures as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, Baltimore County Executive Johnny Olszewski today announced that he has directed the Office of Budget and Finance to implement an immediate freeze on all non-essential hiring in County government.

The non-essential hiring freeze includes all positions except for first responders including Police officers, Firefighters, EMT's, Paramedics, 911 staff, Sheriff's deputies, Correctional officers and public health and human services workers responding to the COVD-19 crisis.

"We are in uncharted territory. While we do not know the full economic impact of this crisis, Baltimore County must take immediate and aggressive actions," Olszewski added. "This is not an easy decision, but a fiscally responsible one. We will continue to prioritize our employees while continuing to provide essential government services for our residents."

As a result of the impact of COVID-19, Baltimore County government currently projects that local revenues will decline by tens of millions of dollars in FY21.

Olszewski will announce his FY21 budget on Tuesday, April 14th.
